

A LESSON ON WELCOMING OTHERS

PK-K -- Immigration - Lesson II (Year I, Day 1)

Goal: To introduce children to the concept of loving our neighbor, even when we might not know him or her, and building a community on Gospel principles.

Materials: map of the world

Lesson:

1. Explain that, as we walk through our neighborhoods or meet new people, we can recognize the face of God in each and every person. This doesn't mean that we have to be unsafe around strangers, but that we should treat every person as a special gift of God.
2. Let the children know that God is in the hearts of every person. (Use examples such as Mom, Dad, siblings, aunts/uncles, friends, people in other countries or seen on the news, people who don't have friends or who are homeless).
3. Remind the children that often, when we think someone is strange or we don't think we want to be friends with someone, it is probably because we don't know them very well. The more we get to know people, the more we understand them and realize they are just like us.

Discussion:

- Why is it good to be friends with people who come from different places than us?
- What can we learn from each other?
- What are some of the things that are the same about every person, no matter where they come from?

Activity: Have students look at a map of the world. Identify where you are, and then identify the places mentioned in the video. Explain to students that there are people who live in different places and it is important to welcome and learn from their culture that is different than ours.

Prayer:

Dear Jesus,

Thank you for giving me friends.

Help me to be kind to my friends. Help me to share.

Help me to welcome new friends and never leave anyone out.
